

- Due to Covid, we are planning to honor this year's deceased Knights along with next year's in the November 2021 KC memorial ceremony
- Checks to ARC, CIRSI, and MIW, as well as to the Marshall County Disaster Relief Fund, were
 presented at a dinner at Legends in November. Given the shortfall in Tootsie Roll receipts this
 year, the funds for these donations were covered by an \$8000 payout of interest from the
 investment fund established by the sale of the hall.
- \$1000 was donated to Guiding Star's John Egnew memorial ultrasound fund.
- LeRoy Jero volunteered to become our council's Financial Secretary now that Roger Drummer is our area insurance agent.
- Karol Smigowski and Steve Ulrich have registered as new members. They will be the first to be
 enrolled using the new initiation procedure which is no longer secret and can involve the family of
 the new member.
- Several Knights have helped with Derecho cleanup at Eldon Schneider's farm.
- Several Knights helped add cushion material to the playground at St. Francis and to install benches there.
